

#### A WORD FROM OUR REVEREND...

#### **Reverend Donald Kuntz**

The Dominican Republic Mission (March 20-30) provided a wonderful experience to be thankful for sunshine and rain. Many of the roads we traveled are not paved, but are the best muddy ruts and potholes the country has to offer. Up in the hills, we were lucky to reach speeds of fifteen miles per hour.

The sense of time is different here on the island. People will walk an hour or two to participate in the rural health clinic, and wait hours as the providers attend to one hundred persons per day. Many of us in Ohio wait to see the doctor, but we are not outside in the rain, and we are not the sixty-fifth person in line. Our thanks to those volunteers who patiently counted out children's vitamins and adult over-the-counter pain medicines. Donated bottles of 1000 pills were transformed into baggies with 30 pills for distribution to patients.

We were in remote places providing Solar Oven education, while families wait a few more months to receive the Solar Ovens. We were not eating with neighbors, because we were not cooking with neighbors, because the Solar Ovens are still in the Dakotas waiting to be shipped to the Dominican Republic.

The most important thing we are celebrating in April is Easter! Easter Resurrection teaches us that we don't know everything about life and death, teaches us God plays by different rules. We are very thankful for the gift of resurrection not only at the end of our days, but all the little resurrections along the way.

We are freed from slavery to

sin, and freed from slavery to death, as a gift of God's grace, a gift of Jesus' sacrifice. We are united with believers all around the world who have been blessed by the Resurrection Reality.
