From the early days of Christianity, there is a sense that the Church consists of not only all living believers, but also all who have gone before us. For example, in Hebrews 12 the author encourages Christians to remember that a "great cloud of witnesses" surrounds us encouraging us, cheering us on.

Charles Wesley, John's brother, picks up on this theme in his hymn that appears in our United Methodist Hymnal as "Come, Let Us Join our Friends Above," #709. In the first verse, he offers a wonderful image of the Church through the ages:

"Let saints on earth unite to sing, with those to glory gone, for all the servants of our King in earth and heaven, are one."



On All Saints Day we remember all those—famous or obscure—who are part of the "communion of saints" we confess whenever we recite The Apostles' Creed. We tell the stories of the saints "to glory gone."

A WORD FROM OUR REVEREND...

Reverend Donald Kuntz

Sharing a pastor has been part of the Methodist Movement since John Wesley agreed to ordain pastors in the new colonies. We have had circuit riders which visited the pioneer churches quarterly then monthly. Lay preachers filled the pulpits all the Sundays until the ordained clergy arrived. Baptisms and Holy Communion were observed quarterly when the clergy were present.

The shortage of clergy in East Ohio Conference of the UMC resulted in more yoked churches (two-point charges) and the employment of more lay preachers until the East Ohio Conference was approximately fifty percent ordained clergy (who had been to seminary) and the rest were lay preachers who had been to licensing school and course of study (less than a full seminary education).

The East Ohio Conference has had two-point charges for decades: Marshallville UMC & Easton UMC, Spencer UMC & Lafayette UMC, LeRoy UMC & Chippewa Church at the Lake UM, Creston UMC & Canaan UMC.

Now clergy are appointed to new configurations of churches called Cooperative Parishes. Some are simple four-point charges: Howland, Hubbard, Braceville, & Brookfield UMC led by Matt Darrin.

Sometimes pastors are appointed with lay assistants in more complicated arrangements:

- East Palestine Centenary, East Palestine Emmanuel, East Fairfield, Good Shepherd, Mount Zion, Rogers and Trinity UMCs led by Lisa Courtwright;
- Loudonville, Lakeville, Perrysville, Bigelow, Moreland, Apple Creek, Fairview, & Mt. Hope UMCs led by Kenn Curren and Jennifer Mellott
- the "Boundary Cooperative:" Bayard, Carroll County Mt. Zion, Carroll County Pleasant Grove, East Rochester and New Franklin UMCs led by Shannon Sampson and Christine Ulman.

As the clergy shortage continues and as economic conditions fluctuate, the Bishop and District Superintendents will continue to do creative things to make sure that churches stay open on Sundays, and lay members continue to develop ministries which extend God's love to the community.

Did you know...

There are 108 billion pounds of edible food wasted each year in the US. One in seven people in Ohio are food insecure.

The Akron Canton Regional Food Bank is part of Feeding America and serves eight counties.

The Seville Community Food Pantry is slowly growing. The partnership that has been established with Seville Presbyterian Church and Jerusalem Lutheran Church gets stronger each month. These partners provide assistance as volunteers and with much needed product.

We are hopeful that the new space will provide a better experience for the neighbors who rely on us. Stop down and see it!







In 2022, we served 176 families with 583 individuals. In just the first 10 months of 2023, we served 197 families with 691 individuals. This ministry of Seville UMC is huge for many people. Thank you for supporting the Food Pantry.


Turkey Dinner

The SPRC committee is now investigating what this might look like for Seville United Methodist Church. We have started conversations with the District Superintendent. We will be continuing to discuss and ask for assistance from our current and future DS.

We hope to have an all-church meeting to show you all the financials and hopefully have someone from the conference come to help explain and answer questions. As we have said, we have questions and no answers at this time.


We hope that you will keep the SPRC committee and the entire church in your prayers as we continue.

Redistricting of the East Ohio Conference

From Bishop Tracy S. Malone

Hear the good news! God is always making all things new! All of this ... new life, new perspectives, new opportunities, new direction, and a new future with hope ... is from God!

We continue to make great progress in implementing the Re-Districting Plan, **transitioning from 10 to four districts beginning January 1, 2024.** The restructuring of the districts will re-direct more attention to the local church, provide greater stewardship, alignment, and flexibility of resources, generate more opportunity for creative ministries, strengthen the possibility for the revitalization of churches, and increase the efforts of starting fresh expressions and new faith communities.



Districts are an integral part of the East Ohio Conference structure and are made up of communities of people, laity and clergy, who work together regionally to share the Good News of the Gospel, to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ, and to fulfill our shared mission of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world". Districts facilitate our collective witness and strengthen the connection with each other, with other churches, and with the communities in our mission fields.

"So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation, everything old has passed away; see everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given to us the ministry of reconciliation."

October Finance

From the Finance Committee:

A church member recently asked: "Where do you expect the church to be financially at the end of 2023? And what would it take to balance our budget?"

Those are great questions. I'm glad they were asked!

"Where do you expect the church to be financially at the end of 2023?"

Projections are never perfect, but they can give us a good idea of where finances might land. With the current shortfall, assuming giving and expenses both remain consistent and taking into account year-end expenses, we look to end the year with a shortfall of (\$9,750).

"What would it take to balance our budget?"

We have approximately 70 Giving Households currently financially supporting Seville UMC. We have 9 Sundays left through the end of the year. It is estimated that if each household could provide an extra \$15 per week, we would cover the projected shortfall.

Many of you have helped this church through your financial gifts, your prayers and the gift of your time. In whatever way you are able to help – no matter the amount – it does make a difference.
