
# J.C. Kids Presents DINNER THEATER at 5PM

#### **April 2024**

The gift of the Resurrection makes us a new people, an Easter People; and opens all kinds of doors for sharing God's love in the world. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to share the light of Christ, to bring the healing of Christ to relationships, to help fill the needs of our neighbors and more. John Wesley taught about social holiness as well as personal holiness.



Personal holiness comprises all those things which bring us closer to God, fills our spiritual wells.

Social holiness is displayed in all our work in the world, using the water from our spiritual wells to tend to others and to turn society around.

"I serve a risen Savior, He's in the world today. I know that He is living, whatever men may say. I see his hand of mercy, I hear his voice of cheer; and just the time I need Him, He's always near."

As we hear each communion Sunday, Jesus' gift for us on the cross frees us from slavery to sin and slavery to death. That looks different for each one of us. Matthew 7:12, "In everything, therefore, treat people the same way you want them to treat you, for this is the Law and the Prophets."







We visited Old Mutare Mission, just down the hill from Africa University. With support from Global Health, this clinic has grown to include new programs for expectant mothers, nutrition support, AIDS and HIV awareness, pediatrics, and an extensive outpatient clinic. People from Mutare will come to Old Mutare Mission for health care rather than going to the public hospital in town. Our apportionment dollars are so important.



We stopped at the Imiri Game Preserve for a game drive. Imiri is a place of rescue. These animals are being cared for in an environment where they are protected from poachers. The only predator is an old lion who was born and raised in captivity. He is kept in a very large enclosure where he has ample room to explore. He is fed each day since he never had the opportunity to learn how to find his own food. The other animals – giraffes, rhinos, warthogs, elephants, zebra, impala – live as God intended, in community and mutual respect.

**Advanced Course(s): Option 1:** (Discovering & Using Your Spiritual Gifts -not required to become a Lay Speaker) "For the Common Good" by Christine Harman Examining Key passages in Paul's writings, author Christine Harman leads readers through a personal spiritual gift assessment. She names 25 distinct spiritual gifts - such as discernment, hospitality, compassion, evangelism, or music - and helps people explore scripture references on each one. After identifying their particular gifts, clergy and laypeople will learn how to apply them for the good of their church, community and the world. This book is the text for a Lay Servant Ministries advanced course on spiritual gifts.

**Option 2:** (Polity & Dynamics of The UMC Resource -needed to become a Lay Speaker) "Life Together in the United Methodist Church" by Beth Galbreath This book gives participants an overview of the structure and organization of The United Methodist Church. The course is arranged in five two -hour sessions with short devotionals at the beginning of each session intended to ground class instruction and discussion in scripture. This book is required for Lay Servants who wish to become certified Lay Speakers.

#### **Feeding the Hungry**

The Bible reveals that, from the earliest times, God's faithful community has been concerned about hunger and poverty. Helping those in need was not simply a matter of charity, but of responsibility, righteousness, and justice (Isaiah 58:6-8; Jeremiah 22:3; Matthew 25:31-46).

As many of us sat down to celebrate with loved ones and family on Easter, we shared in food and fellowship. We can not take this for granted for we are blessed to have such comforts in life. We ask that you please keep in mind those that do not have such opportunity for bountiful family gatherings, an abundance of food and sharing in fellowship. Having the Matthew 25 Outreach and the Seville Food Pantry in our area has an impact on our community. Your prayers also have an impact and show your compassion through your faith to support those in need.

A food pantry is one of the most practical ways that local churches can be in ministry in their communities. Feeding people is a vital ministry of any faith community. We cannot ignore the physical and immediate needs of those around us. The Seville Food Pantry over the past year has grown with the help of members of our church and the community. In January 2024 we fed 18 families and 77 individuals. In February we fed 41 families and 145 individuals. Then in March we fed 35 families and 99 individuals showing the strong need in our area. We thank all who have helped to donate, who have helped those that come to the Food Pantry on evenings or weekends, and we thank those who do a lot behind the scenes to make the pantry available.

Some things to know about MATTHEW 25 Outreach (Cloverleaf)

Individuals served in 2023: 254 families came only once, 108 families came twice. Average 4 visits.

Medina County: 652 households, 140 households in surrounding counties. [792 households total]

2257 people fed, 3227 pantry visits, 75,519 meals in 40 zip codes.

213 families of one person, 212 families of two; 128 families of three; 104 families of four, 65 families of five; 38 families of six persons; 18 families of seven persons, 15 families larger than that.

Our oldest volunteers are over 80 and our youngest is four years old. We have three families where grandparents, parents and kids all serve together. The volunteers have enjoyed refreshments provided by local families: fresh baked cookies and cake, & hot chocolate and good coffee. It doesn't take much to keep our volunteers happy, but it does take 40+ volunteers to complete a food distribution. Many Thanks to Akron Canton Regional Foodbank for the semi truck load each month. Know that your individual donations, your time and support of Matthew 25 Outreach (Cloverleaf) and the Seville Food Pantry are changing lives in Medina County. You are making a difference! Even the Crop Walk, which takes place in October, and all of the other events during the year that contribute into Matthew 25 Outreach and the Seville Food Pantry are helping our community and our families month to month.
