An update on Seville UMC exploring the Simplified Accountable Structure Model (S.A.S.)

At the Town Hall meeting, the Simplified Accountable Structure was introduced to those attending. The new structure would consist of a **Governance Board and Teams** for all the inner workings of the church. Each team would be responsible for seeing their work done.

We are looking for members of the church who would like to be part of a Discernment team. Videos on the SAS training and the Cohort meetings are available for any member interested in being part of the Discernment team. The videos can be watched as a group or individually.

We are also looking at putting together a Prayer team. Our church has many great prayer warriors, please consider being part of the prayer team. Our coach for this discernment is **Reverend Jeffery Croft**.

He has offered to come on Saturday June 29 from 9-11 to discuss SAS with the congregation. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

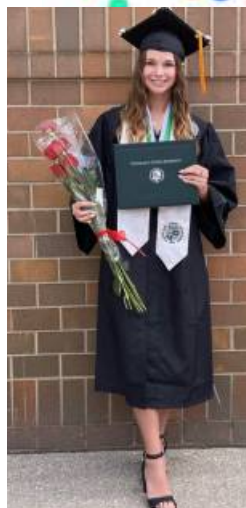

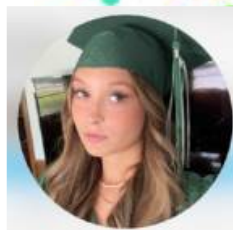


Congratulations Madeline!!

A WORD FROM OUR REVEREND... *Reverend Donald Kuntz*

Many of us love the hymn “Here I Am, Lord” (UMH 593) “I have heard you calling in the night. I will go Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart.”

Dan Schutte the author/composer was a Roman Catholic monk, and he faithfully follows the story in Isaiah, of Isaiah’s call and pledge to serve. Isaiah had a vision of God in God’s throne room (Isaiah 6) with all the sights and sounds and smells that could overpower a person. We usually don’t see that many angels at one time. Isaiah recognizes that he is an unholy person standing in the presence of a holy God. The seraphim have a remedy for that, Isaiah’s lips are scorched with a coal from the fire on the sacrificial altar. This touch softens Isaiah up and he is ready to say yes. We think most people respond like Isaiah: “Sure, I’ll help; send me.” Yet for every Isaiah, there are several Moses, and a few Jeremiahs; people who are resistant to the call of God to serve. Jeremiah says “no I can’t go, I’m only a youth.” This doesn’t give him a deferment or exemption and he has to go anyway. He does not prolong the struggle with God.

The Moses story is probably a meshing of two or more older sources, so some things get repeated and said twice. Moses strings out his resistance. “Who am I, that GOD should send me?” Yet, “what if...?” and “but suppose...?” then he gets down to “I’m not really a good public speaker,” and “hey God, I really think you should send somebody else.” (Exodus 3:11-13; 4:1-13.) God doesn’t allow Moses to waste much more, and in 4:19, the word is “GO!” (I guess God’s patience has its limits.)

How does God get through to us as individuals and as a community of the church, to get us up out of our comfortable chairs and into the game? Maybe we need the sound effects, the lighting effects, and the stage crew to make God’s draft notice compelling. Maybe we all need the hot coal treatment. In our UM Hymnal we read the baptismal vows, (p.34): “Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world and repent of your sin?” “Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?” “Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations and races?”

Evil powers abound. The wickedness of human trafficking and wage slavery are still with us and in some little ways we profit from them every day. The injustice of public school funding determines people’s standard of living for decades to come. Our society has set up structures so people do not have equal access to the courts or to medical care. People are limited by tiers and economic constraints. Some insurance plans offer access to wider ranges of procedures and medications. Increasingly the for-profit insurance system is becoming the problem rather than the solution.

We need to hear a divine wake-up call to follow Jesus into the uncomfortable places to begin setting things right. We were well trained in Sunday School and church from a young age to know the difference between right and wrong. We need to hear God calling in the night, calling us to bring more justice and righteousness, so **God’s will is done “on earth as it is in heaven.”**

“He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?” (Micah 6:8).

Cameroon is a wonderful, beautiful place. Very different from what we know, yet so lovely in its uniqueness. We served as a relational team, strengthening the relationship and building the relationship so that teams can serve there in the future. Cameroon UMC is a district of the Cote d'Ivoire Conference.



We visited the construction site for the new Ebenezer Community UMC building. The foundation has been started and will continue as funds are available. The plan is to complete the foundation and ground level for the congregation to move here as the upper levels are being built. The land purchased for the new church will include a parsonage.



Next, we visited the current church space for Ebenezer Community UMC. This is a small rented space. It is vibrant and welcoming and filled with the Holy Spirit. The current landlord has asked the church to find another space, which

is why the new church construction project is so important. This is where our meeting with church leadership was held.

This group of amazing pastors and church leaders gathered to learn about Global Ministries and UMWIM. Some traveled eight hours to be with us. They heard about how U.S. teams can partner with them and how they might serve in their own communities.



Isaiah 58:10 God's call is to do both! When we feed the hungry, we give of ourselves personally and then our lives shine in dark places. Our needs are also met 'like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail'

After the training and time with district leaders, we enjoyed sightseeing. We visited the Reunification Memorial. Cameroon was a German protectorate. After World War 1, the country was divided between France in the north and the United Kingdom in the South. The two regions were reunited in 1961. Yaoundé is the capital city with over two million people. It covers 70 square miles and is surrounded by seven mountains.

The Ebenezer Community UMC farm consists of two small patches of land. Casava is the main crop this year. Due to the lack of rain, maize will not grow well. Pastor Ndobe and his son currently manage the farm.



The Bitame Lucia School is a site for children age 2-18. The children were taking their final exams as we visited. We heard about the work of Purity, the Global Missions Fellow who was assigned to the school for the past two years.



The national church is the site of the district office and the church served by District Superintendent Ekoka. We were served a meal and greeted by members of the congregation. This church was built with grant funding from Global Ministries. The land purchased is large enough for a clinic and a school as the church expands into its vision of being a place for the entire community.

Our time concluded with worship at Ebenezer Community UMC. It was a weekend of celebration of cultures of Cameroon. Everyone wore traditional dress from their region. It was a beautiful expression of the country and the connection of the United Methodist Church. We were gifted with traditional dress of the Yaoundé region. 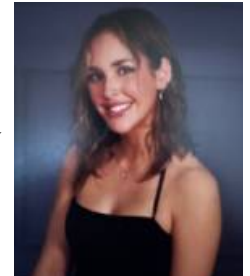

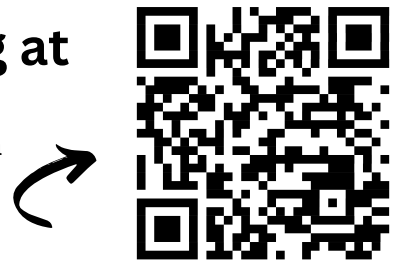
- Summer is here and it will get hot! If you would like to help us with summer "cooling" costs, simply note summer cooling costs as your **second mile giving offering**.

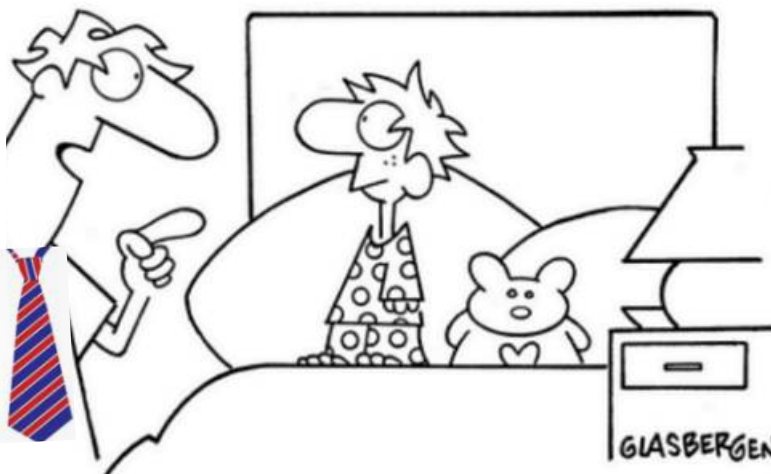
