A WORD FROM OUR ... Reverend Donald Kuntz

This is a wonderful time to be in Ohio, with the changing of the leaves. Many people make efforts to drive to Ohio to see the beauty we see regularly. I am sure some of our neighbors are glad to see an end to hurricane season. Many people have shared with me their preference for the comfortable temperatures of autumn. When I was younger, some foods were only available in season. Now fruits and vegetables come from the other side of the equator and foods are available all year round. Yet the birds and butterflies still celebrate seasons of migration.

Scripture is full of references to God and humanity and creation working in cooperation through the seasons. From Psalm 104, about provision and timing: "You have made the moon to mark the seasons; the sun knows its time for setting. You make darkness, and it is night, when all the animals of the forest come creeping out. The young lions roar for their prey, seeking their food from God. When the sun rises, they withdraw and lie down in their dens. People go out to their work and to their labor until the evening... These all look to you to give them their food in due season; when you give to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things. (Psalm 104: 19-23, 27-28)

From the prophet Jeremiah a comparison of the instinctual behavior of birds who recognize the changing seasons and respond accordingly, to the lack of spiritual awareness among God's people: "Even the stork in the sky knows her appointed seasons, and the dove, the swift and the thrush observe the time of their migration. But my people do not know the requirements of the Lord." (Jeremiah 8:7)

Even from the book of Job, a statement regarding a life in harmony and cooperation with God and creation: For you shall be in league with the stones of the field, and the wild animals shall be at peace with you. You shall know that your tent is safe, you shall inspect your fold and miss nothing. You shall know that your descendants will be many, and your offspring like the grass of the earth. You shall come to your grave in ripe old age, as a shock of grain comes up to the threshing floor in its season. (Job 5:23-26)

Let's work toward the benefits for humanity of greater cooperation in humanity's relationships with God and the planet which supports us.

Mission work at The Border...

I recently engaged in an immersion experience to the border wall near Tucson, AR. The group met with Tucson Samaritans, Arizona Justice for Our Neighbors, Nogales Border Community Alliance, Casa de la Misericordia, Dora Rodriguez, and the county coroner.

We drove several miles of the wall. It is 21 miles long. At the end, we stopped. Our guide called out through the slats of the wall. **Somos amigos! Samaritanos!** (We are friends! Samaritans.) Then she asked us to look and listen. So we did. Waiting and watching for people looking for a better life, a safe place to continue living. *That day, no one came.* All this takes a lot of unpacking. *There is so much more than what is shared here.*



What does the Bible say?

CIVIL AND HUMAN RIGHTS

When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God. (Leviticus 19:33-34)

I [Jesus] was a stranger and you welcomed me. (Matthew 25:35b)

Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. (Hebrews 13:2)

But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it.

(1 Corinthians 12:24b-26a)

What does The United Methodist Church say?

Throughout Scripture the people of God are called to love sojourners in our midst, treating them "as if they were one of your citizens" and loving them as we do ourselves (Lev. 19:33-34)... Welcoming the migrant is not only an act of mission; it is an opportunity to receive God's grace... We call upon all United Methodist churches to welcome newly arriving migrants in their communities, to love them as we do ourselves, to treat them as one of our native-born, to see in them the presence of the incarnated Jesus, and to show hospitality to the migrants in our midst, believing that through their presence we are receiving the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ. (2016 Book of Resolutions, #3281, "Welcoming the Migrant to the US")

We oppose immigration policies that separate family members from each other or that include detention of families with children, and we call on local churches to be in ministry with immigrant families. (2016 Book of Discipline, Social Principles ¶162)

Isaiah 58:10 God's call is to do both! When we feed the hungry, we give of ourselves personally and then our lives shine in dark places. Our needs are also met 'like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail'





Casa de la Misericordia (House of Mercy) is in Nogales managed by the Catholic Church. This is a place for asylum seekers to wait for their turn to meet with US officials who will determine their fate. Some have been waiting three years. Each family has a sleeping space. Every Friday night, a special celebration happens with a communal meal baked in the big stone oven. There is a school and playground for the children. workshop to learn basic skills, and a kitchen to make tamales to sell.

The photo of the butterfly above represents their flight to freedom. It has signs from all their home countries -Nicaragua, Mexico, India, El Salvador, Guatemala, Panama, Cuba, Honduras, China, Peru, Ecuador, Bolivia, China, Chile, Venezuela, Brazil, Haiti, Senegal.

- Mexico is the top origin country of the U.S. immigrant population. In 2018, roughly 11.2 million immigrants living in the U.S. were from there, accounting for 25% of all U.S. immigrants. The next largest origin groups were those from China (6%), India (6%), the Philippines (4%) and El Salvador (3%). (Pew
- One-in-ten Black people in the U.S. are immigrants. The number of Black immigrants living in the country reached 4.6 million in 2019, up from roughly 800,000 in 1980 (Pew Research Center, 2022).

It is Dora's story (see the photo of Dora below) that was most impactful for me. Dora was 19 in the early 1980s when she fled violence in El Salvador with a group of 25 others and headed for the US. Half the group died in the desert. Dora was rescued by border patrol agents and taken to a hospital. When she recovered, she began working with Tucson agencies to assist others on the journey. - Reverend Tammy

Giving Thanks We Provide Stoves for Guatemala Stove Project: In Guatemala, 64% of women cook with wood or charcoal over open fires. Exposure to *smoke from these fires can cause premature death* for over 2,500 people and 1,200 children each year. Stoves are needed in Guatemala to improve the health and well-being of the people who live there, especially in rural areas where many cook with open fires.

The Seville **UMC Outreach Comitteee** is organizing efforts with Reverend Tammy Kuntz and the missionaries in Guatemala to **donate \$1000 for ten stoves (\$100 per stove) to support** the Guatemala Stove Project efforts.






Donating a stove can help save forests and provide a healthier home for women and their families. Our giving provides access to environmentallyfriendly stoves to families in need in Guatemala. The stoves can reduce wood consumption by 60% and smoke by 90%. See the photos of these stoves below. The donor gives \$100 and each Guatemalan family gives \$80 for the water filter and propane tank. 
